A Power of Attorney is a very powerful document. Recent changes to the BC legislation require all individuals who contemplate giving a Power of Attorney to provide detailed instructions to the lawyer regarding the extent and/or restrictions in the Power of Attorney.

There are onerous duties imposed on an Attorney, which include:

A duty to keep detailed and accurate accounting records
A duty to act in accordance with the wishes and beliefs of the adult
A duty to consider property passing by the adult's Will and an obligation to preserve property to the extent that is reasonable and in consideration of actual and potential beneficiaries.
A duty to keep assets separate from the adult
